By signing this Application, you agree to the terms and conditions of smart metering and time-of-use rates in Chapter 13.12 of the Port Angeles Municipal Code.

The BPA can adjust wholesale rates and the City can adjust retail rates, which can affect your energy costs and potential savings.

The smart meter charge is not refundable. If a customer chooses to return to the uniform rate a \$25 utility service fee will be charged. The City reserves the right to change terms, rates, and requirements. The City makes no warranty, expressed or implied, that the examples of ways to shift energy use are appropriate or your energy costs will be more or less under the uniform rate or time-of-use rate.

The Customer shall indemnify and hold harmless the City, its officers, officials, employees, and volunteers harmless from any and all claims, injuries, damages, losses or suits, including attorney fees, arising or issuing out of or in connection with smart metering and time-of-use rates, except as may be caused by the sole negligence or willful conduct on the part of the City.

To Participate You Must...

- ❖ Be a City of Port Angeles commercial electric utility customer.
- ❖ Be charged the time-of-use rate for a minimum term of one-year.
- ❖ Complete and return this application along with a \$400 payment.

Energy Policy Act

On August 8, 2005, the Energy Policy Act was signed into law. The Act is an unfunded federal mandate that requires all electric utilities to offer customers smart meters and time-based rates no later than February 8, 2007.

The Act also requires the City to determine if smart metering and time-based rates will continue to be optional or required after August 8, 2007.

Time-based rates reflect the City's cost of purchasing electricity at the wholesale level from the Bonneville Power Administration.

Smart Metering

A typical meter records energy use and keeps track of total energy use, but does not record which day or what time of day energy was consumed. A smart meter is required in order to participate in the optional time-of-use rate. A smart meter is programmable and separately records energy usage during heavy-load hours (KWHH) and light-load hours (KWHL), and peak demand.

Customers have to pay a smart meter charge and a utility service fee if they choose to participate in the time-of-use rate. The smart meter charge is \$375 and the utility service fee is \$25, for a total of \$400.

Time-Based Costs

About 56% of the City's electric utility costs are for wholesale purchases from the Bonneville Power Administration (BPA). Approximately 96% of wholesale costs are time-based. Time-based costs include energy used during KWHH and KWHL, and peak demand.

Definitions

KWHH: is energy used from 6:00 A.M. to 10:00 P.M. Monday through Saturday between monthly meter readings.

KWHL: is energy used during all other hours (excluding KWHH) between monthly meter readings.

Peak demand: is the period of peak use measured in KVA (kilovolt-amp apparent power) during KWHH between monthly meter readings.

Pacific Prevailing Time applies.

Time-of-use Rate May Reduce Energy Costs

Are you able to conveniently shift KWHH to KWHL? Examples of the most convenient ways to shift energy use include:

- ✓ Install a time clock on a water heater to only operate during KWHL.
- ✓ Operate appliances only during KWHL (e.g., clothes washer, dryer and dishwasher).
- ✓ Reduce the temperature setting of your heating system during KWHH.
- ✓ Alter business practices to shift other energy use to KWHL.

Uniform Rate

You are currently charged a uniform rate which includes three components:

1. A monthly basic charge.
2. A uniform rate per kWh.
3. Demand charges also apply to General Service Demand and Primary customers. Power factor adjustments may also apply.

Optional Time-of-use Rate

The optional time-of-use rate consists of up to four components:

1. A monthly basic charge.
2. A higher rate per kWh consumed during KWHH.
3. A lower rate per kWh consumed during KWHL.
4. A lower rate per KVA applies to General Service Demand and Primary customers. Power factor adjustments do not apply.

Time-of-use rates vary based on customer rate class including: general service, general service demand, non-profit/tax deductible, and primary.
